It's YOURS if you WANT it!

We all like gifts don't we? The bigger the better is more exciting! And the packaging has a lot to do with the excitement as well. In fact, when you see a beautifully wrapped package that is the biggest under the tree, you can't help but hope that the package will be YOURS!

But why wait until Christmas to receive a gift such as what you may find under the Christmas tree? There IS a gift that is available to you every day and it comes with hope and love and eternal life. You can't get any bigger or better than that. One part of the gift is HOPE. Hope is found in the promises God has given us—promises of freedom from sin. No matter what trials, temptations or pain we may suffer, we can always hold onto the hope God extends to us. Follow these scriptures to find that HOPE:

1 John 5:13-14, 1 Peter 1:3-6, Ephesians 2:8-10, 2 Corinthians 4:16-18 and John 4:13-14.

Secondly, the gift of JOY. Joy, oh, joy, when that package you open reveals just the right gift! Just what you wanted! But did you know that happiness is not only delightful, it is a fulfilling in our lives that is essential for long life. Joy is in fact a profound sense of happiness and contentment that comes with a deep, abiding relationship with God not necessarily in a package. This is not a fleeting happiness, but a fruit of the Holy Spirit. Galatians 5:22-23. Joy is choosing to respond to external circumstances with inner contentment and satisfaction, knowing that God will use these experiences for His purpose. When you open that package and have a feeling of joy, do you show your gratitude to the giver? Is that not a way of showing happiness and contentment? Is this feeling of joy not found in the love that not only God can give but that you can give to another by being thankful? Be reminded that 'when they saw the star, they were filled with joy!' Matthew 2:10. That joy came from a gift from God!

And most of all.....PEACE. Do you get a peaceful feeling when all the packages are opened and everyone is satisfied that they received the gift they wanted? It gives you a feeling of relief that you don't have to return the gift or exchange it. Whew! Now you can relax and be at ease or *at peace*. Peace is something everyone wants, yet few seem to find. How would you describe peace? Is it tranquility, harmony, security, prosperity or well-being? I think that when it comes to gift giving, peace takes over when the gifts are accepted and adored. You know that you did a good job in your selection.

That brings us to the three things that are mentioned....Hope, Joy, and Peace.

The gift from God by the birth of His son gives us all three.

We have hope in eternal life, joy in sharing the gift of His birth, and peace that only God can give, and He gave us the greatest gift of all!

He was very satisfied in His gift giving. He knew that His gift would last forever! Even when it was tattered and torn on the cross, it came back to life for you and me.




Steve Huskey and Tyler Lewis were on hand to replace the metal siding on the fascia boards that storm Helene ripped off on September 27, 2024!




Be Thankful!




